Introduction _____

**I. FIRST, NOTICE THE _____ OF
THE TEXT.**

Paul had established Israel’s guilt in the early chapters of Romans. In fact, chapters 1-2, he charges all mankind in GENERAL and the Jews in PARTICULAR:

A. First, through _____ God has revealed His nature to mankind (Romans 1:20) *“For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead: so that they are without excuse.”*

B. Secondly, through _____ God has revealed His presence to mankind. (Romans 1:19). *“Because that which may be known of God is manifest in them for God has shewed it unto them.”*

**II. SECONDLY, CONSIDER THE
_____ OF THE TEXT (Romans
10:14-21).**

A. First, notice the _____ of hearing the Gospel (10:14-17).

B. Secondly, note the _____ and proof of Israel’s hearing (10:18-21).

1. Question #1: Has Israel really heard the Gospel? (10:18).
2. Question #2: Has Israel understood the revelation they had received? (10:19-21).
