THE "WAYS" AND "WOES" OF LIFE

Psalm 1:1-6

Introduction:	 		

I. FIRST, NOTICE THE "WAYS" OF THE SUCCESSFUL BELIEVER (Psalm 1:1-3).

- A. First, note how he is be <u>separated</u> from the <u>world</u> (Psalm 1:1).
 - 1. First, there is a <u>way</u> in which he will not <u>walk</u> (1:1b) "... walketh not in he counsel of the ungodly..."
 WHY?
 - a. First, the "counsel of the ungodly," <u>denies</u> the sufficiency of Scripture dealing with problems of the Christian.
 - b. Secondly, the "counsel of the ungodly," dignifies and exalts the pride of man and takes away the glory of God,
 - c. Thirdly, the "counsel of the ungodly,"

 <u>decreases</u> or minimizes the need for the cross of Christ by asserting either the basic goodness of man of by downplaying the extent and impact of the fall.
 - d. Fourthly, the "counsel of the ungodly," directs or focuses on pleasing self rather than pleasing the Lord and others.

- 2. Secondly, there is a <u>trail</u> that he should never <u>take</u> (1:1c) "... nor stand in the way of sinners..."
- 3. Thirdly, there is a <u>seat</u> where he should not <u>sat</u> (1:1d) "... not sit in the seat of the scornful."

BIBLICAL ILLUSTRATION:

Lot:

- a. First, he *walked* toward Sodom (Genesis 13:11).
- b. Secondly, he <u>stood</u> with the Sodomites (Genesis 13:12b).
- c. Thirdly, he <u>sat</u> at the gate of Sodom (Genesis 19:11).
- B. Secondly, notice how he is to be <u>saturated</u> with the <u>word</u> (Psalm 1:2).
 - 1. First, it tells us to take *pleasure* in the Word (1:2a).
 - 2. Secondly, it tells us to ponder the *promises* of the Word (1:2b).
 - 3. Thirdly, it tells us to study it *perpetually* "day and night."
