- A. First, he saw the _____ Lord (1:13a) “*And in the midst of the seven candlesticks one like unto the Son of man . . .*” That describes His _____.
- B. Secondly, he saw Him as the _____ Christ (1:13b) “*clothed with a garment down to the foot . . .*” That depicts His _____ as King
- C. Thirdly, he saw Him as the _____ Christ (1:14a) “*His head and his hairs were white like wool, as white as snow . . .*” This speaks of His _____ as King.
- D. Fourthly, he saw Him as _____ Christ (1:14c) “*. . . and his eyes were as a flame of fire . . .*” Here it is referred to as the _____ of the King.
- E. Fifthly, he saw Him as the _____ Christ (1:15a) “*And his feet like unto fine brass, as if they burned in a furnace . . .*” This speaks of the _____ of the King.
- F. Sixthly, he saw Him as the _____ Christ (1:15b) “*. . . and his voice as the sound of many waters.*” This has reference to the _____ of the King.
- G. Seventhly, he saw Him as the _____ Christ (1:16a) “*And he had on his head seven stars . . .*” This speaks of the _____ of the King.

H. Eighthly, he sees Him as the _____ Christ (1:16b) “*. . . and out of his mouth went a sharp two-edged sword . . .*” This speaks of the _____ of the King.

I. Ninthly, he sees Him as the _____ or glowing Christ (1:16c) “*. . . and his countenance was as the sun shineth in its strength.*” This speaks of the _____ of the King.

II. SECONDLY, NOTE HIS SERVANT IN AN _____ SITUATION (Revelation 1:17a).

- A. First, notice His servant in _____ submission (1:17a) “*And when I saw him, I fell at his feet . . .*”
- B. Secondly, not His servant in _____ fear (1:17b) “*. . . as dead . . .*”

III. THIRDLY, CONSIDER THE LEADER AS _____ SOVEREIGN (Revelation 1:17b-20).

- A. First, notice how He conveys His _____ (1:17b). “*And he laid his right hand upon me, saying unto me, fear not.*”
- B. Secondly, note how He shares His _____ (1:17c-18).
