Psalm 27:1-14

Introduction. _____

Consider man's problem and God's promises as it relates to fear:

I. FIRST, NOTICE MAN'S _____—HIS FEAR (Psalm 27:1-3, 5, 13).

David describes what FEAR does to one:

A. First, he speaks of how fear will *intimidate* (27:1).

B. Secondly, he speaks of how fear will *immobilize* (27:13).

II. SECONDLY, NOTE GOD'S _____—HIS FAITHFULNESS (Psalm 27:4-14).

A. First, he knew the Lord would _____ up his despairing heart (27:5-6).

B. Secondly, he knew the Lord would _____ his devastated heart (27:7-10).

C. Thirdly, he knew that the Lord would _____ his distressed heart (27:11-14).

CONCLUSION: In summarizing this Psalm, David shows how to work to overcome all our fears (24:4).

1. First, seek the Lord in time of fear by _____ faith in Him alone (Psalm 27:1-3).
2. Secondly, seek the Lord in time of fear by _____ on the Lord Himself (Psalm 27:4-6),
3. Thirdly, when fear returns; seek the Lord by _____ your focus to the Lord in heartfelt prayer (27:7-12).
4. Fourthly, continue seeking the Lord continually _____ your faith in Him (27:13-14).
