

## IS THERE ANY HOPE?

Titus 2:11-15

Introduction. \_\_\_\_\_

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Let's examine three classes in the world today in respect to their relations to HOPE:

### I. FIRST, LET'S NOTICE THOSE WITH \_\_\_\_\_ HOPE (Ephesians 2:11-13).

A. Here Paul reminds us of the \_\_\_\_\_ of the past (2:11)

B. Secondly, he reminds us of the \_\_\_\_\_ of the past (2:12).

C. Thirdly, look at three \_\_\_\_\_ or classes of people who have NO HOPE,

### III. THIRDLY, CONSIDER THOSE WHO HAVE \_\_\_\_\_ HOPE (Titus 2:11-15).

Look what this “*blessed hope*” produces:
