Introduction: _____

I. FIRST, NOTICE MAN’S REBELLION AGAINST GOD (Romans 1:18).

- A. First, man’s rebellion expresses itself in that it is unwanted by the nature of man.
- B. Secondly, man’s rebellion exposes itself in that it is unaccepted by the religion of man.

II. SECONDLY, NOTE MAN’S REVELATION OF GOD (ROMANS 1:19-20). THE EVIDENCE: SELF-EVIDENT TRUTH!

- A. First, notice the place of God’s revelation (1:19a). Evidence that the truth is within man—the truth of conscience. We will call this the inner light!
- B. Secondly, note the power of God’s revelation (1:19b) Evidence of God’s seen in nature or creation. We will call this the outer light!
- C. Thirdly, consider the purpose of God’s revelation (1:20).
