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## I. FIRST, NOTICE THE <u>SETTING</u> OF THE PASSAGE (Luke 12:49-53).

A. First, let's *explore* some Old Testament passages relating to the present times.

- 1. First, there is Jacob's <u>anticipation</u> of "the last days" relating to the 12 tribes (Genesis 49:1).
- 2. Secondly there is Moses <u>alerting</u> the Israelites of "the latter days" (Deuteronomy 31:29).
- 3. Thirdly, there is Jeremiah's *admonition* to Israel relating to *the latter times*" (Jeremiah 30:24).
- 4. Fourthly, there is Joel's <u>advice</u> to Israel relating to the Holy Spirit's coming in "the last days" (Joel 2:28-32).
- B. Secondly, let's *examine* a New Testament passage relating to present times (2 Timothy 3:1-5).
  - 1. First, notice the *circumstances* surrounding the last days (2 Timothy 3:1).

- a. First, notice how the last days will have <u>unsafe</u> times (3:1b). "... perilous times shall come."
- b. Secondly, not how the last days will be <u>unswerving</u> times.
