## **BENEFITS THAT BAFFLE** Psalm 103:1-5

- FIRST, THERE IS THE BAFFLNG I. **BENEFIT OF SALVATION (Psalm 103:1-3)** Kev Verse #3.
- A. First, note there is *forgiveness* (103:3a)
- B. Secondly, notice there is *healing* (103:3b).
  - 1. First, notice some *lies* about healing.
    - a. LIE #1: "Faithful and Godly people don't get sick."
    - b. LIE #2: "Faithful people don't stay sick, they always get better or it is not God's will for people to stay sick."
    - c. LIE #3: "If a person prays hard enough prays in "faith"—God will always remove the affliction."
    - d. LIE #4: "God has abandoned me!"
  - 2. Secondly, note some *truths* about praying for healing.

- a. First, *remember* the great promise of Psalm 103:3).
- b. Secondly, *recognize* the spiritual benefits for us in suffering.
  - (1) Suffering can *refine* our faith (1 Peter 1:7).
  - (2) Suffering makes us mature (James 1:2-4).
  - (3) Suffering *allows* us opportunity to display the works of God (John 9:1-5).
  - (4) Suffering conforms us to the image of God (Romans 8:28-29).
  - (5) Suffering *produces* in us perseverance and character (Romans 5:4-5).
